KEYNOTE SPEAKER: SUMMER WILLIS



Summer Willis is in her 25th season as the Spirit Squad Director for Weber State and has led the Wildcats to numerous national championships and unprecedented recognition. She has led the Weber State cheer team to a combined 10 national championships, the dance team to five national titles, and the Waldo mascot to three national championships. The Weber State cheer team has reached unrivaled success in recent years. The Wildcat Large Coed team has won seven straight national championships (2017-24) and eight overall championships. Weber State has also won three of the last four Grand National Championships, winning in 2021, 2022, and 2024. The small coed team has won two national championships and won the grand national title in 2024. Waldo has won three national titles and WSU has also had several partner stunt championships. Willis has also overseen the Wildcat dance team that has won three Hip Hop national championships (2017, 2018, 2021, 2024) and also won the Jazz Grand National Championship in 2024. In 2024, the Weber State dance team also represented Team USA at the World ICU Championships and took home the gold medal in Hip Hop. Willis began her career at Weber State in 1998 as the Spirit Squad Director and also worked in Marketing and Promotions for Wildcat Athletics. She has also served as the head coach of the Utah Jazz stunt team for nine years. Willis is a native of North Ogden, Utah, and graduated from Weber High School. She was a cheerleader at Utah State University and graduated from USU in 1998 with a degree in Communications and Public Relations. She is the granddaughter of Weber State Hall of Fame member Wallace "Wildcat" Morris, who played football for Weber College in the 1920's. He was a Junior College All-American and had the nickname "Wildcat". He is the namesake of the Weber State nickname "Wildcats". She and her husband Dave are the parents of three children, a son Tytan, and twins Maverick and Madden.

ANGIE BAKER



Angie is an Arizona native and graduate of ASU. She cheered, tumbled, stunted and danced for over 20 years. Angie worked with the United Spirit Association teaching camps and judging regional and National competitions. She danced professionally for the Arizona Rattlers and Arizona Cardinals before stepping into the coaching role in 2010. Angie spent 9 seasons as the Director for the Rattlers before her current role as Director of the Arizona Cardinals Cheerleaders. Cameron Larsen is a four-time power tumbling and trampoline national champion. In college, he was a cheerleader at Weber State University and was on the 2009 NCA College National Champion team. Cameron has worked for the Universal Cheerleaders Association since 2007 and currently serves as the Varsity Spirit State Director for Utah and Idaho. Additionally, Cameron is a full time V!ROC choreographer and has choreographed routines across the country with accomplishments including state championship titles in over 15 different states and multiple national titles for UCA, USA, and NCA. As a coach, he has been a member of the coaching staff at Corner Canyon High School for 12 years and has helped the team to their 6 state titles and 3 UCA National Championship wins.
